Missouri Department of
Conservation Cost Share

City Clerk Melissa McChesney gave the first reading of Bill No. 2026-062, an ordinance approving a cost share agreement with the Missouri Department of Conservation.

Capital Projects and Parks Manager Noel Bennion said she consulted with the Missouri Department of Conservation, and they approved a grant to cover 50 percent of the landscaping costs at VarietyKC Inclusive Park to plant 44 box trees and wildflowers.

Capital Projects and Parks Manager Noel Bennion stated the native play area was included in the FY2027 capital improvement program budget. Staff would be seeking a grant for \$1 million, which was half of the total estimated cost of the project. She said a resolution would be presented at the meeting on August 18.

Electric Motorcycles

City Attorney Paul Campo said he was looking at regulations for electric motorcycles, which were different than electric bicycles. Staff saw an increased use of electric motorcycles and was concerned about driver safety. He noted that some cities had adopted regulations regarding electric motorcycles. A code amendment would be presented at a future meeting.
